Level 2 Bikeability Training for Children in Year 5
Tuesday 9th June & Wednesday 10th June 2026

Your child has been offered the opportunity to take part in Level 2 Bikeability cycle training. The training will take place on either **Tuesday 9th June or Wednesday 10th June 2026** at Lower Broadheath. The base for the start of the training is Lower Broadheath Primary School.

You will need to be able to transport your child, with their bike to meet a member of our staff at Lower Broadheath for 08:45am, they will stay for the day (confirmation of which day will follow prior to the 9th/10th June) will need packed lunches and a refillable drinks bottle.

What is Bikeability?

Bikeability is the government's national cycle training programme that teaches children practical cycle skills and how to cycle safely and confidently on roads.

Cycle training is taught by friendly, qualified Bikeability instructors. Courses include Level 1, where children learn the fundamentals of cycling in a traffic-free environment, Level 2, where they learn cycling techniques and road safety on quiet roads, and Level 3, that focusses on more advanced cycling skills.

Important information for parents/carers:

- Your child needs to bring a suitable and safe bicycle to training. Please check it is fully working and roadworthy before training commences. Bikes that are considered unroadworthy or unsuitable will not be allowed to be used. You must be prepared to organise and pay for any repairs to make your child's bike roadworthy.
- Instructors may make adjustments to cycles, such as seat/handlebar height or brake lever position to assist children's riding position.
- Please make sure that your child has the appropriate clothing to suit cycling and changing weather conditions and the time of year.
- We insist your child brings a helmet which must be the correct size and fit. This should bear a recognised test standard such as the BSI Kite Mark, ANSI or American Snell B. 95, European CE Mark. The instructors may refuse to train a child if they deem the helmet unsuitable. (The child should be able to fit their own helmet.)
- Your child must attend the whole training session to achieve the Bikeability award.
- Trainees will be under supervision at all times. Any misbehaviour will not be tolerated.
- If your child is considered to be unsafe, they may not be allowed to continue training.
- Whilst every care will be taken to ensure your child's safety, your attention is drawn to the insurance cover provided by Worcestershire County Council which is for public liability only and does not provide Personal Accident Insurance for anyone undertaking this course, nor does it accept responsibility for the actions or personal behaviour of participants. Worcestershire County Council is not responsible for any injury to persons or loss or damage to property which does not result from the negligence of an instructor.
