What does Geography look like at Broadwas CE VA Primary School?

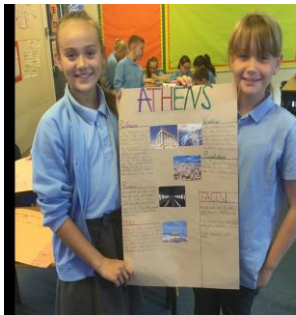
Through the teaching of geography, we hope to instill a love for enquiry and investigation in our children. Our aim is to motivate our pupils to take an active part in contributing to and protecting our world as they grow up. We believe geography can inspire curiosity and fascination about the world and its people. We feel it is important to nurture their inquisitive thinking and questioning skills to help them interpret what they see.

At Broadwas we want all of our pupils to have an understanding of the past and how history will shape their future.

In Key Stage 1 children will develop an awareness of their local environment by conducting field work surrounding the locality. They will also be linking the development of their geography skills with history topics when studying castles.

In lower key Stage 2 children will study Egypt, Rainforests, Food Farming from Around the World, Britain from the air – maps and landmarks, Extreme Survival - climates and environment and The Great War.

Upper Key Stage 2 will be learning about the earthquakes and volcanoes, the physical features of the United Kingdom, Greece, North and South America, Human Geography including settlements and Local Studies.
